

Isaac Newton Institute for Mathematical Sciences

Special Call for Proposals Deadline 31 July 2011

The Newton Institute is a national facility based in Cambridge, UK, and attracts scientists from all over the world to research programmes in all areas of the mathematical sciences, broadly understood. Typically about 80% of its programmes are interdisciplinary. At any one time there are two visitor programmes at the Institute, each with about thirty participants. Ninety programmes have been completed to date; past and future programmes are listed at www.newton.ac.uk/programmes.html. Administrative support is provided for housing, library, computing etc., and around £60,000 per month is available to each programme towards travel and subsistence support for participants and organisers.



The Institute now invites proposals for research programmes in any branch of mathematics or the mathematical sciences. The deadline for submission is 31 July 2011, for consideration at the meeting of the Scientific Steering Committee in October.

For programmes in the period September – December 2013, the Institute is particularly keen to encourage cross-disciplinary proposals which could form part of the international initiative *Mathematics of Planet Earth 2013* www.mpe2013.org, the interpretation of which is intended to be "as broad as possible". For that initiative, the Institute will consider proposals for programmes of one to four months duration. Details on submitting proposals are at www.newton.ac.uk/callprop.html.
